About WLUML:

Women Living Under Muslim Laws (WLUML) is a **volunteer** transnational feminist solidarity network that promotes human rights and gender justice and equality for people whose lives are shaped, conditioned or governed by patriarchal and/or authoritarian interpretations of Islam. For over thirty-five years, WLUML has worked with feminist movements to break women's isolation and build our collective power.

Our work aims to bridge the gap between scholarly advancement and discourses on women, human rights and gender equality and the interested public to promote plural democracy. Working with WLUML, the intern/research fellows will develop research and collaboration skills and gain practical experience as members of a passionate and engaged team while supporting the rights movements in Muslim societies around the world.

This includes researchers, practitioners, activists in Muslim countries, and those working towards gender equality, human rights, and social justice. We are committed to mobilizing the feminist scholarly advancement in service of activists and advocates who are working to promote gender equality. As a feminist think tank, we believe sound research should be the basis of advocacy.

Research and Publications Intern/Fellowship

Women Living Under Muslim Laws (WLUML) seek a Research and **Publications Interns/Fellows** to support the works of its Research and Publications Committee. The intern is expected to work roughly 10 hours a week for a period of six months with the potential to extend.

The responsibilities are:

- to help to develop research and publication proposals,
- edit and proofread articles and prepare them for publication,
- to support the existing publication administration,
- to be in communication with various research fellows, writers, contributors, and networkers, and
- to help to organize webinars and meetings with different committee members

This position will report to one of the lead Committee Coordinators, Prof. Mona Tajali, Prof. Homa Hoodfar, or Dana Kamour.

- Strong command of the English language (Ability to read and speak other languages, such as Arabic, Farsi/Dari, Pashtu, Urdu, Turkish, and French, is an advantage)
